In 2017, a rule change included a new category of "Dangerous Substances" used, manufactured, possessed or distributed in a child's environment, even if a child is not home. Meth category was expanded to additional illegal substances.</p> <p>All of the ECI LR funded programs help to prevent child abuse by offering support and decreasing stress in homes and child care environments.</p>

This grant increased requirements for child care providers and affected rating levels and the number of providers.</p> <p>*Revisions to the Quality Rating System (QRS) are due to go into effect January 2019 and become the Quality Improvement Rating System (QRIS). This is expected to again affect the levels of ratings.</p>
